







- A- ASHLAND ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

HISTORY...

"Lee Smith, 'Pa', was known for growing Clay County Yellow-Meat in the early 1900's. For years, I only knew yellow-meat watermelons." -Winston Wheeles



Lee Smith & Emmit Brewer were the known farmers in the early 1900's. Today, known farmers are Zenus Windsor, Rayford Smith, & Leon Morris.

"Watermelons take 105 days from plant to harvest until they are ready. The 2 different kinds of Clay County Yellow-Meat include one with a dark green rind and one with a light green rind and dark stripes. You'll know its ready when it ain't slick and the curls are brown."
