PLANNING MEETING ASHLAND CITY COUNCIL JANUARY 19, 2021

The Ashland City Council met for a Planning Meeting on January 19, 2021 at 5:00 P.M. in the Ashland City Hall Auditorium with Mayor Larry J. Fetner presiding. Council Members present were Dianne Ballard, Bobbie J. Steed, Kim M. Cain, Annette F. Gaither, and Tommy Cantrell. Also present were City Clerk/Administrator Chelsey Wynn, Assistant City Clerk/Court Clerk Robin Catrett, Maintenance Equipment Operator Phillip Stinson, Maintenance Supervisor Lester Robinson, Fire Chief Brett Thompson, Police Chief Joseph Stanford, AND Ray Stansell with the Clay Times Journal.

Mayor Larry J. Fetner called the meeting to order.
